News to Use:

Personal Property Tax (H599): CALL TO ACTION!! The personal property tax legislation—House Bill 599—was passed by the House Revenue & Taxation committee on an 11-7 vote. We appreciate all the support we've received by members in contacting this committee to ask for their support. We encourage everyone to contact the House of Representatives in anticipation for the full House vote early next week.

Our grassroots campaign is still ongoing, and we are encouraging folks to fill out those mailers to legislators to show their support in eliminating this unfair tax. Grocery Tax Credit Bill still in Senate Committee: The Senate Local Government Committee began listening to the debate on the Grocery Tax Credit Bill this Thursday. After a significant amount of testimony, the committee vote was delayed until next Tuesday when the full committee could be present. This IACI-supported legislation increases this "Food Tax Credit," starting with an increase to \$50 for the poorest Idahoans, \$30 for all other Idahoans, and an additional \$20 for seniors, for tax year 2008. The credit would continue to increase each tax year by \$10 until reaching \$100.

Local Option Constitutional Amendment: Today the House Revenue & Taxation Committee passed a constitutional amendment which would limit future local option sales taxes to November elections and to a 2/3 supermajority vote. The bill would also limit the tax to only a city or a county. It passed the committee on 13-5 party line vote, and now heads to the House Floor. To amend the Constitution, you must have approval of two-thirds of both Houses in the Legislature and a majority vote of the people at the next general election. Governor Otter has signaled his support for this idea by sending a letter to the committee members backing the Constitutional amendment.

Transportation Funding: There are ongoing negotiations regarding a compromise to enhance the funds for road construction and maintenance. Currently Idaho is facing a \$240 million annual shortfall in funds necessary to maintain the transportation infrastructure. IACI is engaging with other business interests like the Associated General Contractors, as well as legislative leadership and the Governor, to assist in the development of legislation.

IACI Employer Protection Act House Floor: The IACI-backed legislation to legitimize employer non-compete contracts with employees that passed the Senate with a 25-10 vote, is going to be the first bill heard on Monday when the House convenes. The legislation gives employers assurances that contracts with key employees to protect the business can be legally made and enforced. The concept provides that the freedom of people and businesses to enter into contracts is protected.

Motor Vehicle Inspections: Last week the House passed House Bill 586, the Motor Vehicle Inspection Act, on a 42-26-2 vote. Today, H586 received a do-pass recommendation from the Senate Resources & Environment Committee with only one no vote. This IACI-supported legislation would

provide authority to the Department of Environmental Quality to authorize a vehicle inspection and maintenance program. One of the major reasons behind IACI's support for this legislation is our concern about reaching non-attainment status, causing the Environmental Protection Agency to step in to regulate our state for us. We believe it would be much better for the state of Idaho to run this program, rather than be required to implement restrictive and federally-mandated control measures. The bill now moves into the full Senate for consideration.
